

Summer Assignment: 11th Grade Grade Level Modified
2020-2021

Your summer assignment focuses on new scientific discoveries and the challenges they posed to the established hierarchies of the Catholic Church and Feudalism. The focus of this assignment is on **heliocentrism**, the belief that the sun is at the center of the solar system, and the planets revolve around it. **There are three parts to this assignment: a guided reading worksheet, a reading assignment, and a documentary.** For each part, answer the questions in writing. USE YOUR OWN WORDS. They will be collected on the first day of class.
